## Beaverhill Bird Observatory

Weekly Update June 30 – July 9 2023

It was another busy week out at the BBO! While our MAPS banding for this round was delayed due to poor weather, a busy day at Sora Pond made it well worth the wait. Highlight captures for this round included a Hermit Thrush on BLAB, a Black-and-white Warbler on SOPO, and several Tennessee Warblers.

Staff have been hard at work completing various surveys around the natural area during the days between banding. Jon has been surveying the forest breeding bird grid to map out songbird breeding territories, Cala has been monitoring Least Flycatcher nests to assess their productivity in the natural area, Ethan has continued monitoring shorebirds on Beaverhill Lake, and Sierra has been inventorying

plant species in the natural area.

One interesting occurrence in the natural area this week has been an outbreak of what appear to be sawfly larva throughout the forest. These caterpillars have been eating the upper layer of balsam and aspen leaves, resulting in the leaves dying and parts of our forest looking like autumn! Following this outbreak, we've noticed a large number of Tennessee Warblers invading the natural area. We suspect they are feeding on the larva while they molt their flight feathers after breeding!
