Weekly update: May 15th to May 21st

Spring migration is in full swing at the BBO! This week saw many familiar species in high numbers, such as Clay-colored Sparrows and Yellow Warblers. Swainson's Thrushes have continued their high volume, with a total of 41 new bands. Gray-cheeked Thrushes have been surprisingly frequent visitors as well, with five being banded this week.

We completed our Big Birding Day on May 20th, reporting a grand total of 133 species throughout the day. Despite the rain halting our banding for the day, we were productive in other ways, finding species throughout the county, in Tofield, and in Elk Island. Big Birding Day was the perfect way to round out our totals, with 177 banded birds throughout the week, including 24 species captured.

There were also plenty of warblers passing through in beautiful spring plumage, with Black-and-white, Black-throated Green, Blackpoll, Magnolia, Myrtle, Tennessee, Orange-crowned, and Western Palm Warblers being banded. Despite some rainy days causing low net hours, many days were extremely productive, with a high of 117 birds on May 21st.
