Weekly Update September 7-13, 2024

This week's weather was cold, rainy, and windy. The limited net hours made for exceptionally low captures this week, despite a high volume of birds being sighted around the nets and the natural area. We did capture a few new species for the fall season: a handful of White-crowned Sparrows, a Hermit Thrush, and a Swamp Sparrow were the new tallies. Noteworthy sightings around the lab included the first Golden-crowned Kinglet of the season, as well as a steady overhead stream of Greater White-fronted Geese and Sandhill Cranes. Fall migration really is in full force!

Owl banding also began to pick up this week, with a total of 9 Saw-whet Owls being caught. For the 2024 owl banding season we also added a second set of nets using the call of a

male Saw-whet Owl as the audio lure. We hope this will increase our capture numbers and help

us get an even better understanding of these owls! As well, we managed to deploy 4 more Motus nanotags this week. Owl nanotag sponsorships are still available, if you want to sponsor a tag you can do so here!

Between rounds of banding, staff have been taking the time to get caught up on data submission and report writing. Reports for our summer research projects are being edited and finalized, and papers from our student interns are in the final stages of proofing as well.
