## **Beaverhill Bird Observatory**

Weekly Update August 16-22, 2025

Following the hustle and bustle of last week's Young Ornithologist Workshop, the folks at the BBO have readjusted to their normal falltime routines - but with a twist. This week, songbird migration monitoring has been accompanied by owl banding! Yes, you read that right, owl banding in August! This experimental early start to owl monitoring has produced very encouraging results; three Northern Saw-whet Owls and two Long-eared Owls have already been captured in the four evenings of non-standard owl banding.

Owls are truly showing up everywhere! A Long-eared Owl was even captured during songbird banding on August 20<sup>th</sup>! What makes this even more remarkable was that this LEOW was a recapture, marking the *first recaptured Long-eared Owl at/associated with the BBO* since

the inception of owl banding here in 2018!!

Banding highlights and bird sightings from the week leave little to be desired! Warblers are certainly on the move, and we banded fall migration's first Canada Warbler and American Redstart this week! Sightings from the clearing include a Black-throated Green warbler, Western Tanager, a Blue-headed Vireo, and a Ferruginous Hawk!
